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Purpose


- The County will be collecting data from numerous private wells to accomplish its efforts under:
 - CASGEM
 - County Long Term Monitoring
 - Data Collection to Support Basin Characterization
- The County does not have a Groundwater Data Confidentiality Policy
 - For use in Outreach efforts
 - For use by Staff

Key Components

- Outreach and Authorization Efforts
- Public Release of CASGEM Information
- Use and Release of Other Data
- Participation in the Water Data Library
- Data Base Security
- Water Code Sections 13751 and 13752
 Compliance (Supplemental Handout)

- CASGEM Publishes Information Considered Proprietary under the Water Code
 - Participation by County is Mandatory
 - DWR assumes County has obtained the required permissions

 CASGEM makes public portions of the well completion report



- CASGEM provides well location information in the form of:
 - a set of latitude/longitude coordinates
 - a map interface
- See LSCE paper on CASGEM and well location accuracy



- The County has an interest in an improved and robust data collection effort
 - Elevation and quality data
 - Well logs and geological information
- The Water Data Library publishes nonproprietary information
 - Could be considered sensitive by some well owners
 - Participation is voluntary

- Privacy concerns could hamper data collection efforts
 - More participants are needed
 - For CASGEM basins lacking monitoring wells
 - For gaps in overall data collection efforts
- Outreach materials need to clearly inform potential participants
 - Data confidentiality
 - Use of information depending on program
- All information is subject to a Public Records Act request


- Potential Owner Concerns:
 - Well location
 - Ownership
 - Groundwater elevation
 - Groundwater quality
 - Well construction information
 - Liability
 - Third party misuse of information

 - Participants in the CASGEM Network – 2011: 4 wells in MST; 10* wells in Napa Valley Floor (NVF); 1 well in the Carneros Subarea
 - Detailed well information entered into CASGEM online system in October 2011
