Napa Complex Fire Update

Media briefing scheduled for 9 a.m., Wednesday

NAPA – Napa County has scheduled a media briefing for 9 a.m., Thursday, October 12, at the Napa County Sheriff’s Office located at 1535 Airport Blvd, in Napa County.

Emergency response agencies continue to fight multiple fires in Napa County. The County’s Emergency Operations Center remains active and is staffed around the clock. Emergency declarations have been issued at both the state and federal levels.

Emergency Updates and Information:

A Community Meeting is scheduled for 4 p.m., Thursday, October 12, 2017 at the Napa Valley Unified School District Auditorium, 2425 Jefferson Street, Napa, CA.

CAL FIRE continues to release fire activity and containment information at approximately 7:00am and 7:00pm daily at fire.ca.gov.

Incident information and health information is available on the Napa County Web site at CountyofNapa.org, and also being shared with our media partners and through social media channels on Facebook and Twitter. For the most updated information and alerts, text your zip code to 888777 to receive Nixle alerts about the fires and evacuation information.

Evacuation Information:

Mandatory evacuations remain in place. CountyofNapa.org includes an updated map of the impacted areas. It is illegal to enter mandatory evacuation areas.

Law enforcement will maintain a presence in evacuated areas to assist people and protect property. Emergency Responders are actively performing safety assessments of burned areas to determine when it is safe to lift evacuation orders.

Atlas Peak

Mandatory Evacuations: Atlas Peak Rd; Monticello Rd from Atlas Peak Road to Circle Oaks; Soda Canyon Rd; Vichy; Hagen; Olive Hill; Monticello Park; the Avenues; Coombsville Rd; Silverado Country Club; Hardman; McKinley; Estee and Monticello Mobile Home Park; Wooden Valley Rd; Coombsville Rd to Wild Horse Valley Rd; Silverado Trail between Trancas and Sage Canyon; Sage Canyon between Silverado Trail and Turtle Rock; SR 128 Capell Valley; Gordon Valley, Berryessa Highlands; SR 128 to Putah Creek; SR 128 to Monticello Dam; Steele Canyon to Putah Creek.

Advisory Evacuations: areas east of Silverado Trail (from Trancas Street to Soscol Avenue), east of Soscol Avenue (between Silverado Trail and Imola Avenue), East of HWY 221 (from Imola Avenue to SR 29), east of SR 29 (from HWY 221 to Jameson Canyon Road), north of Jameson Canyon Road to the Napa/Solano County line.

Evacuation Centers: Napa Valley College Gym; Wooden Valley Rd and Monticello/Circle Oaks are being evacuated to Solano Community College Library parking lot.

Partrick/Carneros

Mandatory Evacuations: Partrick Road; Redwood Road (west of Browns Valley Rd); Carneros Inn; Old Sonoma Rd to Buhman; Buhman to Henry; Henry to Dealy; Duhig at Las Amigas; Las Amigas at Cuttings Wharf; Lovall Valley Road; Stanly Lane

Evacuation Centers: Napa Valley College Gym; and Crosswalk Community Center

Tubbs Calistoga

Mandatory Evacuation: all areas in the City of Calistoga and unincorporated areas.

Evacuation Center: American Canyon High School

Mandatory Evacuation: Mount Veeder Rd; Dry Creek (Oakville Grade to Orchard Ave).

Evacuation Center: Napa Valley College Gym
