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Private Property Owners Impacted by 2017 Wildfires
The last day to submit a Private Debris and Ash Removal Plan to Napa County is:

Monday, November 20th at 5:00p.m.
(Napa County will issue abatement orders after this date)

Because of the risks of ash and debris on public health it is critical that debris be removed as soon as possible. The California Office of Emergency Services has established a deadline for Napa County to begin enforcement and abatement proceedings for property owners that have not submitted a Right of Entry (ROE) Form or a Private Debris and Removal (DAR) Plan. Napa County has reached out to private property owners with damage by mail, email and phone and previously extended the deadline to November 13th to submit a Right of Entry Form to participate in the No-Cost Government Program. Resources from the US Army Corp of Engineers are in Napa County assisting with the removal of debris and ash.

As we enter the holiday season we recognize that for those who have lost or damaged property the impact of the loss may be felt more significantly and keeping up with deadlines may be a challenge. Supporting those directly impacted by this event remains the County's top priority.

Impacted owners still have time to avoid enforcement. The last day to submit a Private Debris and Ash Removal Plan to Napa County is Monday, November 20th at 5:00p.m. Property owners should be advised if immediate action is not taken, and neither an ROE or DAR Plan has been submitted by the deadline above, enforcement action will occur. Don't miss this important deadline.
