Applicants sought for Napa County Wildlife Conservation Commission

NAPA – The County Executive Officer announces three openings on the **Wildlife Conservation Commission**, due to expiring terms, with one opening representing **Youth** (ages 15-25), and the term expiring on February 1, 2020, and two openings representing **Public at Large**, with the terms expiring on February 1, 2021.

The Commission meets quarterly and conducts special meetings on an on-call basis as needed, usually at the Napa County Library Community meeting room, 580 Coombs Street, Napa, CA.

The purpose of the Napa County Wildlife Conservation Commission is to advise the Board of Supervisors on policy matters related to the preservation and enhancement of wildlife and their habitats. The Commission annually submits a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors for allocation of State Department of Fish and Game fine monies. For the past decade, the Commission and Board have apportioned funds where they will best preserve/protect wildlife resources and educate the community in those matters.
